29.95	Make reference to the Text Table 6 for a definition of the terms used in this paragraph: tourism characteristics products, tourism connected products and non-tourism related products.
22.97	This Paragraph talks of a full set of TSA accounts consisting of 10 tables but there is no description of the content of these tables. Describe each table or make reference to the relevant publication.
29.112 29.113	The statement "a set of environmental protection accounts can be compiled using fairly standard satellite account techniques according to the following steps…all these steps are described in detail in the SEEA manual." is vague. Elaborate or make a precise reference to the SEEA Manual.
29.116- 29.118	Introduction of the environment adjustment items (depletion, defensive expenditure and environmental degradation) is quite abrupt. This should be prefaced with a statement of the need of such adjustments in the macro aggregate GDP. See Para 10.4 in SEEA.2003.
29.130	The statement "each of these headings is broken down into a number of finer categories" should be modified to say that the categories listed are at one digit level which can be extended to two and three –digit level.
