Addendum

1. The attached table, giving available information in connexion with the recurrent publications of the Statistical Office of the United Nations, was prepared at the request of the Commission's Working Group on International Statistical Programmes and Co-ordination at its fourth session (June 1972). The Working Group "felt that for the purposes of discussing the JIU report, the Statistical Commission would find it useful to have a table listing each statistical publication, indicating its periodicity and timeliness, and summarizing its content, purposes and uses, circulation, income and costs" (see E/CN.3/420, para. 10). Each recurrent publication is covered except the World Trade Annual,<sup>1/</sup> and the Supplement to the World Trade Annual,<sup>1/</sup> which are published and sold by an independent firm through agreement with the United Nations. Consequently, data on the number of copies printed and the cost are not available.

2. The dollar figures under column (5), "Printing cost", cover all contractual printing costs in connexion with the printing of copies required for official purposes, i.e., United Nations official distribution copies shown in column (4a), "United Nations distribution". Contractual printing costs include composition (type-setting), paper, press run, covers and binding of which composition is the single most expensive element. The cost of printing copies for sales purposes (column 4b) is not available; however, the copies printed for sales embody cost only for paper, press run, covers and binding. Those publications for which no

cost figures appear in column (5), i.e., Population and Vital Statistics Report, 2/  
World Energy Supplies 3/ and Growth of World Industry, vols. I and II, 4/ were  
reproduced internally by the United Nations, and cost figures by individual  
publication are not available. The sources for the data shown in column (5) were  
taken from the Secretary-General's budget estimates for the financial year ....  
submitted to the General Assembly 5/ for the relevant years.

3. It is difficult to compute the average timeliness of data which appear in the  
Monthly Bulletin of Statistics (United Nations publication) owing, in part, to the  
diversity of the types of series contained therein. For some series - for example,  
price quotations on commodities, certain external trade and financial statistics -  
data are available for immediate publication; however, for other series, such as  
indexes of industrial production etc., the time lag is longer. Also, for any given  
series the data for some countries are available earlier than the same series for  
other countries.

4. The Yearbook of National Accounts Statistics 6/ appears in two volumes and  
printing and cost data are reported jointly. However, there was a small time  
difference in the issuance of volumes I and II of the 1970 Yearbook: volume I  
was issued in June 1972 and volume II in March 1972. For the 1969 Yearbook, both  
volumes were issued in October.

5. The figure of \$US21,000 was estimated as the publishing cost of the official  
copies of the last issue of the Yearbook of International Trade Statistics shown in  
the attached table, 7/ since the printing process was expected to be changed to  
computer offset.

6. Commodity Trade Statistics 8/ is issued as data for countries become available.  
For example, vol. XX contains data only for 1970 and the first fascicle in the  
volume, covering the United States and Sweden, was published in October 1970; the  
latest, No. 43, covering Australia, French Guiana, Guadeloupe, Martinique, Réunion,  
Israel and New Zealand, was published in May 1972 and it is expected that at least  
four more fascicles, on several remaining countries in vol. XX, will be issued as  
data become available.
