Proposed draft work programme of the Statistical Office of the United Nations, 1982-1983, and medium-term plan,

1984-1989

Note by the Secretariat

- 1. The Statistical Commission will have available, during the session, the proposed draft work programme for 1982-1983 and the draft medium-term plan of the Statistical Office for 1984-1989 (documents E/CN.3/XXI/CRP.1 (and E/CN.3/XXI.CRP.2, respectively). Changes recommended by the Commission will be taken into account in revising the proposals to produce the draft work programme, budget and medium-term plan to be submitted to the Committee for Programme and Co-ordination, the Economic and Social Council and the General Assembly.
- 2. The Committee for Programme and Co-ordination at its twentieth session requested a/ that the attention of intergovernmental bodies reviewing the draft plans should be drawn to the following provisions of General Assembly resolution 31/93 of 14 December 1976 in which the Assembly:
 - "5. Requests the Secretary-General to take measures to involve more closely the sectoral, functional and regional programme-formulating organs in the planning and programming process;
 - "6. <u>Urges</u> those organs to refrain from undertaking new activities not programmed in the medium-term plan and the subsequent programme budget unless

a pressing need of an unforeseeable nature arises as determined by the General Assembly".

The Committee also requested the Secretary-General to ensure compliance with the planning and programme-budgeting procedure set forth in the resolution.

- 3. The Secretary-General wishes to draw attention to paragraph 2 (p) of resolution 34/224 of 20 December 1979 by which the General Assembly, establishing guidelines for medium-term planning in the United Nations stated that "the planning process should ... make it possible to identify ... activities of marginal utility".
- 4. The Secretary-General also wishes to recall General Assembly resolution 32/206 of 21 December 1977 which in paragraph 3:

"Requests such bodies /functional, sectoral and regional/ to propose, through the Committee for Programme and Co-ordination, relative priorities to be accorded to the various subprogrammes within their respective fields of competence".

- 5. The proposals of the Statistical Commission on these priorities will be transmitted to the Committee for Programme and Co-ordination.
- 6. As is the case with the programme budget, the approval of the medium-term plan is a prerogative of the General Assembly.
- 7. The proposed work programme, contained in document E/CN.3/XXI/CRP.1, is based on the 1982-1983 proposed programme budget for the statistical programmes, which will be submitted through the Committee for Programme and Co-ordination to the General Assembly at its thirty-sixth session. Each subprogramme is described separately, following a statement of its objective.
- 8. The proposed medium-term plan, contained in document E/CN.3/XXI/CRP.2, will be submitted through the Committee for Programme and Co-ordination to the Economic and Social Council and the General Assembly in 1982.

POINTS FOR DISCUSSION

- 9. The Commission may wish:
- (a) To comment on the proposed draft work programme for 1982-1983 and the medium-term plan for 1984-1989;
- (b) To identify any activities that may be obsolete, of marginal usefulness or ineffective and;
 - (c) To propose priorities to be accorded to the various subprogrammes.
