

## SUMMARY

Philippines ranks 63 in the Open Data Inventory 2016 with an overall score of 43%. The overall score is a combination of a data coverage subscore of 49% and a data openness subscore of 38%.

Philippines scores higher than the regional median across all three major data categories. Within the country, the highest levels of coverage and openness are on economic statistics and the lowest levels are on environmental statistics.

## RECOMMENDATIONS

### Coverage

- Collect and publish more recent data in social and environmental statistics.

### Openness

- Create a clear and open terms of use policy, such as CC BY 4.0, for all websites publishing official statistics.
- Publish more data in machine readable formats such as XLSX, CSV or JSON.

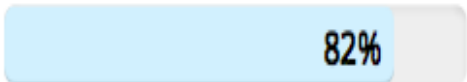

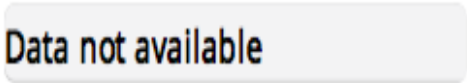
Open Data Inventory 2016



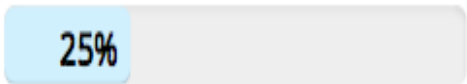
Statistical Capacity Indicator 2016

## Current status of open data adoption in the PSA

1. 40% of PSA datasets on the PSA website are in .csv format; the remaining 60% are targeted to be online within this year
2. PSA provides user access to microdata/PUFs
  - microdata undergo anonymization processes
  - microdata for household-based surveys/censuses can be downloaded/requested through OpenStat Portal and the National Data Archive section of the PSA website
  - microdata for establishment-based surveys cannot be downloaded from the website but can be accessed in a controlled environment (PSA data enclave)
3. On registers
  - List of Establishments used as a frame for establishment-based surveys
  - Data from the civil registry system are used to generate vital statistics (births, deaths, marriages)
