Congratulation Mr/Madame honorable chair in leading the 50<sup>th</sup> United Nations Statistical Commission (UNSC) 2019.

- 1. Malaysia would like to share our views on agenda item 3 (a) on the Report of the Inter -Agency and Expert Group on Sustainable Development Goal Indicators (SDGs). We are pleased to welcome the report and convey our note of appreciation for the effort undertaken by Inter-agency and Expert Group in the development of a global indicator framework to monitor the goals and targets of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. <u>Malaysia</u> <u>fully supports all the proposals indicated in the report in strengthening data and statistics for the development of SDGs indicators.</u>

- 3. Capacity building in Asia Pacific is important and this is coordinated by ESCAP. The declaration on "Navigating Policy with data to Leave No One Behind" call upon development partners :
  - a) To provide coordinated technical, financial, technological and capacity-building assistance to countries and to ensure countries have full access to data held by development partners in support of the implementation of the collective vision and framework for action and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development;
  - b) To consult the national statistical office or national statistical system concerned before conducting any statistical study or survey; and
  - c) To continue to develop and strengthen international statistical standards and to provide technical support for their implementation.
- 4. Malaysia acknowledges and will adopt the criteria for the implementation of the guidelines on data flows and global data reporting for the SDGs as contained in <u>annex I</u>, the six annual refinements in the global indicator framework as contained in <u>annex II</u> and the proposed work programme of the Expert Group for 2019.
- 5. DOSM has also embarked in compiling the SDGs indicators and the publication will be released in April 2019.
- 6. To further enhance the capacity of Malaysia in the compilation of SGDs and sharing our experiences, we would like to participate actively in any forums/workshops/relevant activities with regards to sustainable development framework.
