The 2030 Agenda has brought attention to the new data sources, partnerships, skills and practices National Statistical Systems (NSS) require to meet the unprecedented demand for data and statistics. Whilst the 'big data' momentum has prompted opportunities to improve and invest in new data sources, methodologies and business processes, many Chief Statisticians recognize methodologies and business processes are necessary but not sufficient to maintain the reputation of, and trust in, the National Statistics Office.

Countries in Asia and the Pacific are increasingly drawing on non-traditional methods, non-traditional sources of data and new partnerships to deliver official statistics which meet the test of practical utility. A high level panel of Statisticians from across Asia and the Pacific have kindly agreed to share their experiences in harnessing opportunities of technological advances and new data sources, the new partnerships and skills required, highlighting lessons learned and considerations for the global statistical community.

Recognizing the opportunity to hear directly from Chief Statisticians, ample time will be provided for discussion. Ms. Derval Usher, Head of Office of the Jakarta-based UN Global Pulse Lab will moderate the discussion.
