Background

- Cooperation between the Nordic statistical offices financed by the Nordic Council of Ministers
- Harmonisation of Nordic statistics on migration and integration – all based on (linked) data from administrative registers
- Detailed statistics – allows for comparisons also of subgroups in the population – data for SDG indicators
- Potential for comparative analysis and research

Which areas are compared?

- 11 statistical bank tables on population, education (participation and highest level), labour (employment) + persons not in employment/education.
- Tables divided by immigration category (immigrant/descendant), country background (20 largest) and years of residence.
- Tables including “Reason for migration” (only for Sweden and Norway).
- Expansion: Unemployment, income, industry/profession, demographic developments. Better coverage for all the Nordic countries.

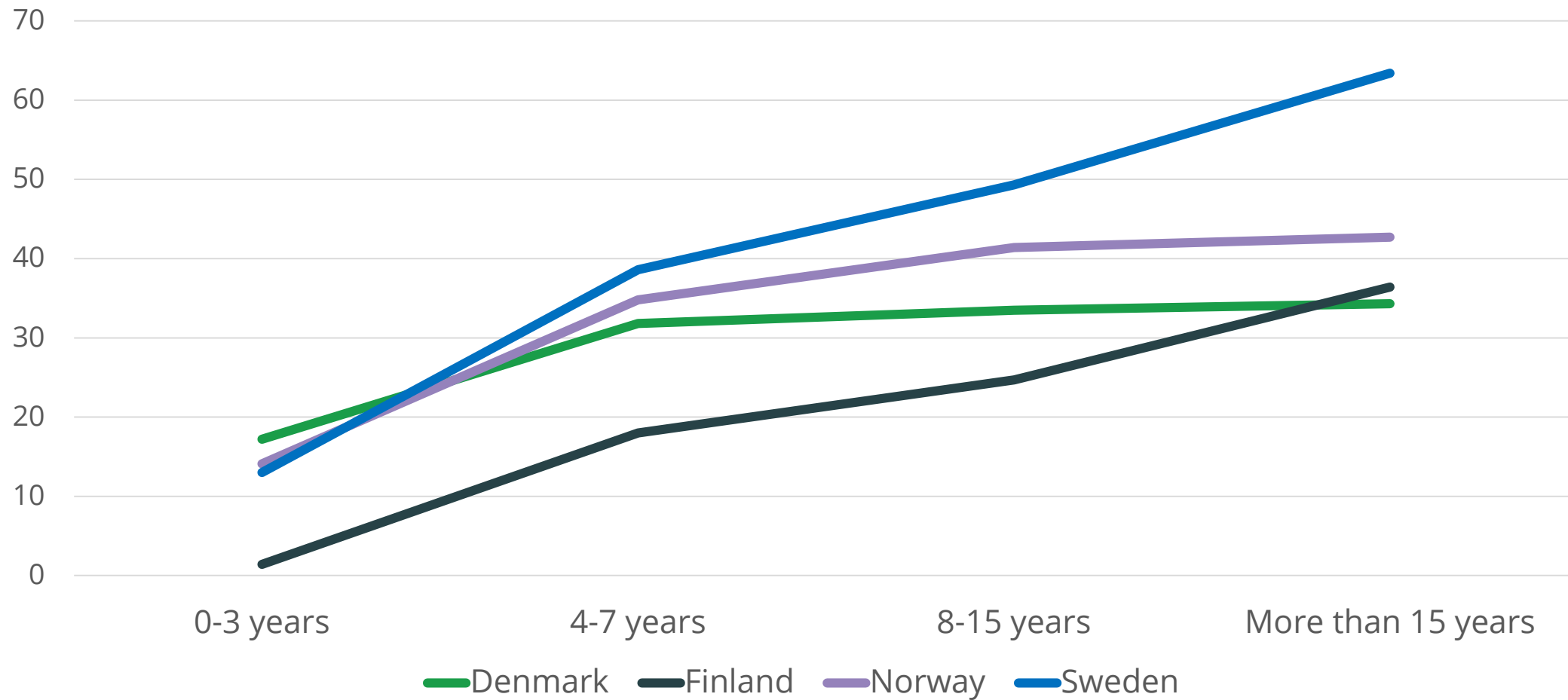
