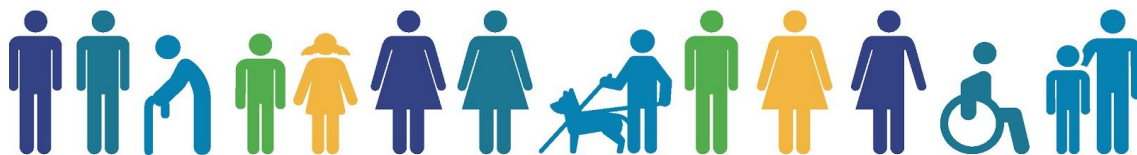

Overview:

Realizing the vision to Leave No One Behind and improving marginalized peoples' lives with targeted policies relies upon the generation and use of inclusive and disaggregated data. New approaches and collaborations around inclusive data are emerging, but for us to reach the furthest behind by 2030 much more is needed. Convening representatives from national statistical offices alongside multilaterals and civil society organizations, this interactive session will focus on sharing learnings and best practices which have the potential to be scaled-up or adapted to different contexts to advance data inclusivity. Co-hosted by the Inclusive Data Charter (IDC) and IDC Champions, the event seeks to increase collaboration and coordination across different actors and geographies. More broadly, the session aims to foster longer-term partnerships to increase technical capacity and encourage commitments to the Inclusive Data Charter. The session will facilitate open discussion and knowledge sharing between all participants.
