<i>Statement provided by:</i> Republic of Korea	
<i>Statement:</i> <p>The international statistical community has been working towards transition from existing traditional statistical methodologies into new approaches, which utilize various data sources, such as administrative sources and big data.</p> <p>In particular, the use of administrative data has been regarded as a highly effective alternative covering various sectors, needless to mention of population or establishments.</p> <p>Yet, it is essential to draw active cooperation from data holders and standardize data formats.</p> <p>In fact, it is not a few countries around the world that face the same issue. Therefore, the Republic of Korea supports the launch of a collaborative on the use of administrative data for statistical purposes at the global level.</p> <p>It is expected that the collaborative will provide recommendations that will help member states convince data holders into cooperation and prepare adequate institutional instruments.</p> <p>Furthermore, given that the field survey environment has been deteriorated due to COVID-19, a significant consideration has to be made to provide member states with technical assistance to strengthen capacities in implementing non-face-to-face surveys.</p> <p>The Republic of Korea is willing to share our e-learning contents and big data training courses through our the Statistics Training Institute.</p>
