Mexico thinks that the most relevant activities of the IAEG-SDGs in the current context are the impact	
of COVID-19 on SDGs indicators and having a guideline on data disaggregation so as to leave no one	
behind. The pandemic has led to the emergence of new vulnerable population groups (temporary	
workers, seasonal workers, for example) and the informal sector has grown. It is important to have an	
international guideline to assist us in the prioritization process of data disaggregation. Without a	
doubt, it will be a challenge for most of the statistical institutes in which the Geospatial Information	
Working Group will allow us to generate new sources of information.
