<i>Statement:</i> Indonesia would like to express our full support for the implementation of System-wide Road Map for Innovating United Nations Data and Statistics in order to transform the data.un.org portal as a single point of reference. Indonesia have two following concern regarding this topic:  a) It is necessary to add the information in the report regarding the reasons why the four targets are chosen as priority areas in the Road Map as mentioned in Para.12. b) A wider use of administrative data, including big data, should be encouraged as modernized and better-coordinated data collection in order to solve the problem of increasing respondent burden and to produce more timely statistics. However, the use of big data should comply with statistical rules to produce official statistics. Therefore manual guidance and capacity development are required to support the implementation of the modernized data collection.
