Hungary appreciates the progress of work of the task teams of the Committee, the future work
programme of the Committee for 2021–2022, the launch of the revision of the manual International
Merchandise Trade Statistics: Concepts and Definitions 2010 and the Manual on Statistics of
International Trade in Services 2010.
In our opinion the creation of a new task team to coordinate the joint research agenda between
business and international trade statistics, and the related processes and mechanisms of the revision
