Needed revisions:		
At the end of this paragraph, it is mentioned that immigrants lacking any visas or legal migration		
	included as a part of the resident population of that country. Although, this	
matter is not wrong, but it is not compatible with register-based censuses because illegal immigrants		
are not principally considered in these kinds of censuses. They are identified when arrested by legal		
authorities and they are soon deported from the country, In this case, a register-based census takes into account the persons as part of the population who are going to be deported from the country		
and put aside from the population of that country.

In this case, a person is included in the flow of migration, but he/she is not included in the immigrant		
populations (stocks); accordingly, there is an incoordination between the immigration flows and		
immigrant populations (stocks). In measuring periodical migration, all persons who have changed		
their country of residence during a specified period, regardless of their place of birth or citizenship,		
should be included in both the immigration flows and immigrant populations (stocks).
