

## 4<sup>th</sup> ROUND TABLE MEETING OF SMALL ISLAND DEVELOPING STATES 2021 United Nations Statistics Commission 16 February 2021 15:00 – 16:45 (Eastern Time)

This annual round table meeting of the Small Island Developing States (SIDS) in the margins of the 52<sup>nd</sup> session of the United Nations Statistics Commission aims to convene representatives of national statistical offices from developing countries and regional and multilateral organizations to exchange on current developments and initiatives on statistics in SIDS, update participants on the pressing statistical challenges confronting SIDS and to formulate recommendations to address these key challenges. Issues relating to the Sustainable Development Goals and the SIDS Accelerated Modalities of Action Pathway (SAMOA) will be explored as a possible common and/or harmonized approach for statistical development of SIDS.

The meeting will be held in round table format and is intended to deliver the following outcomes:

- Better understanding of and transparency around different initiatives in SIDS and their region;
- Stock-take of ongoing statistical efforts in various countries in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic; and
- Concrete next steps and proposals to move ahead with key topics for SIDS.

The session will build on the previous successful editions of the round table, in particular the 3rd round table in March 2020, which included several updates on the review of the SAMOA Pathway and the monitoring and accountability framework under development; SIDS National Focal Points network; SIDS Statistics Exchange Platform; Caribbean regional strategy for the development of statistics (RSDS); Pacific Sustainable Development Report; and country sharing of current initiatives and developments.
