

Overlapping Disadvantage - Using Data Disaggregation to Support Marginalized Groups

Concept Note

Data disaggregation is essential to identifying and monitoring marginalized population groups' situation and fulfilling the promise to leave no one behind. Since 2015, much progress has been made to develop a minimum disaggregation set and disaggregation standards for all SDG indicators. Building upon this work, there is growing recognition that multidimensional data disaggregation is required to identify and 'reach the furthest behind first' as inequalities often overlap or 'intersect' in ways that create and compound deprivation. For instance, ethnic minority women in many rural areas face higher child mortality rates (UNDP, 2018).

This session aims to share the practical steps NSOs and organizations are taking to implement multidimensional disaggregation and distill learnings and principles to inform others' approaches. The session will feature presentations from NSOs and organizations on their approaches and learnings and an open Q&A segment.

This session will inform an ongoing Inclusive Data Charter project to produce knowledge products on this intersectional data disaggregation.
