


The Global COVID-19 survey of NSOs reveals the new challenges

- Survey by UNSD and WB to provide information to effectively mobilize technical and financial support to statistical activities
- Three waves to date:
 - 5 17 May 2020 (response rate: 122/218)
 - 7 25 Jul 2020 (response rate: 112/195)
 - 23 Sep 15 Oct 2020 (response rate: 125/195)

 <u>Bank</u> websites and data shared with partners




Highlights from the second round of a global COVID-19 survey of National Statistical Offices





The pandemic has disrupted the regular operations of National Statistical Systems across the globe...









... as they increase their efforts to satisfy the data demands from governments and other sectors of society

October 2020: Has your institution planned or implemented the collection of any data on COVID-19 and its impacts?








Funding has been seriously affected


As a consequence of the COVID-19 pandemic, are you facing difficulties in operating due to funding limitations / constraints?



(May 2020)




Has your funding been affected due to the current COVID-19 pandemic?

Have financial resources initially allocated to the Population and Housing Census been reallocated to other government activities?







Are you in need of additional financial support to face the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic?










NSOs are establishing new partnerships to bridge data gaps

Share of NSOs that have established new partnerships, by type of partnership








Need to accelerate co-investment in data solutions

Take aways

- While common approaches have emerged, there are important differences in how NSOs from low- and high-income countries are addressing the challenges resulting form the COVID-19 crisis
- There is a <u>clear need for co-investment in data systems and infrastructure</u> to improve the resilience of the NSOs and allow them to respond adequately and at speed to future crises.
- As domestic resources are redirected to COVID-19 priorities and donors face budget reductions under the weight of the pandemic there is an urgent need for a collective action to make more effective use of what funds are available
