- (a) Malaysia acknowledged the report of the work of the High-level Group for Partnership, Coordination and Capacity-Building for Statistics for the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. Malaysia has contributed to the third United Nations World Data Forum by sharing Malaysia's experience in the session entitled 'Developing national SDG indicators what is the data situation from 'leaving no one behind' producer and user perspective', presented by the Chief Statistician Malaysia.

Malaysia acknowledged and supported all actions from January to December 2022 for preparations of the United Nations World Data Forum: April 2023, Hangzhou, Zhejiang Province, China.
