The UNWDF provided us with an opportunity to catch up with the most recent developments in the application of new data sources, and it also gave us a chance to contribute to data innovations, which are the core of Statistics Poland's development agenda:

- 1) as a lead up to the UNWDF, Statistics Poland co-organized and hosted the Road-to-Bern event: "Harnessing Remote Sensing for Sustainable Cities," where we discussed possibilities of remote sensing and showcased practical applications of alternative data sources for SDGs; the hybrid format of the event attracted various data users and data producers from all over the world (stat.gov.pl/en/events/international-events/event-harnessing-remote-sensing-for-sustainable-cities,5,1.html),
- 2) remote sensing was further explored at the 2021 DGINS Conference on Earth Observation for Official Statistics, co-organized and hosted by Statistics Poland in a hybrid format in Warsaw (dgins2021.stat.gov.pl).
