*Statement:*

The work of the CES has a very good reputation in the international community, therefore, Mexico considers that every time a report or model is completed, it could be shared so that the interested communities could learn about it and take advantage of the details of its job.

When the scope of the ECE studies can favor the modernization of national statistical systems, we suggest that they continue to be presented in plenary or special sessions organized by the Commission.

Mexico welcomes the sharing of the progress and challenges associated with the production of statistics on SDG, climate change and statistics for disaster risk reduction.

Mexico considers that the work of the HLG-MOS has been very relevant not only for the proposals of models, standards and innovations, but also for its approach to making them "ready to operate", as they are accompanied by guides, use cases, workshops and even communities of practice such as machine learning. This work approach is very useful for making strategic decisions and for having support in implementation.

Mexico has benefited from its direct and active participation in different groups of the CES and we have shared our experience in the Latin American region; we hope to continue doing so.
