The Netherlands welcomes the establishment of the Network of Economic Statisticians and we endorse the terms of reference of the Network and we endorse the proposed activities and deliverables of the work program of the Network for 2022.

Statistics Netherlands sees this new network as a great opportunity to foster the collaboration of National Statistical Institutes and international organizations in order to respond to new global phenomena by transforming and challenging the existing system of statistical infrastructure, operations and data solutions.
