<i>Statement:</i>	
<p>(a) Indonesia would like to express sincere gratitude and appreciation for the great efforts of the Working Group on Open Data.</p> <p>(b) Indonesia approves the proposed guidance on how to implement an open by default model for dissemination of statistics. The guidance covers all the essential parts in statistical data dissemination process. Indonesia transparently publishes statistical data and metadata, and also provides various ways to access data.</p> <p>(c) Indonesia agrees about best practices of data licensing and its relation to the national laws. In Indonesia, government data is not categorized as copyright subject hence the data is released under public domain dedication. Statistical products in the form of publications are disseminated by including the domain name as a watermark. However, we will consider to adopt the best practice that fulfill the organization needs.</p> <p>(d) Indonesia admits the discussion about open data should be connected with data stewardship since both are strongly related to statistical data dissemination. As the result the guidance can be harmonized.</p> <p>(e) Indonesia approves further work on open data in three areas including the open by default principle, interoperability and local-level open data. This program is in-line with one data initiative which promoting production of quality statistics by government bodies across Indonesia so that can be interoperable and statistics can be produced effective and efficiently.</p>
