
### Life satisfaction

Question: "Using a scale of 0 to 10, where 0 means "very dissatisfied" and 10 means "very satisfied", how do you feel about your life as a whole right now?"



• Indicator: High life satisfaction defined as answer of 8 to 10

Percent reporting high life satisfaction, Canadians aged 15 or older, 2021 to 2024.





Percent reporting high life satisfaction, Canadians aged 15 or older, 2021 to 2024.




