Guiding Principles



Governance – Senior Management Level

<u>Option 1</u> Status quo	Bureau of the Statistical Commission supported by the Secretariat to produce the global work program working closely with the existing statistical groups.
<u>Option 2</u> Facilitation or coordination group	Restricted mandate would limit the new group to facilitating the coordination and communication between the statistical groups and consulting on their global priorities.
Option 3 Option 2 with added responsibilities	Coordination group from option 2 with broader mandate for providing a strategic vision, provide advice to the Statistical Commission and existing reporting lines would be respected.
Option 4 Option 3 with modified reporting relations	Existing statistical groups would report to the new coordination/facilitation group.
