

Eduardo Sojo Garza Aldape

Eduardo Sojo has led a distinguished career in both public service and academia.

In the Federal Government, during President Fox's 2000 electoral campaign, Sojo served as Chief of Staff and as Economic Coordinator of the President-elect's Transition Team. From 2000 until 2006, Mr. Sojo served as Chief of the Presidential Office for Public Policy and Coordinator of the Economic Cabinet.

Sojo was the Economic Advisor of the President Felipe Calderón Hinojosa during his presidential campaign and later 2007-2008 he served as Secretary of Economy.

In the course of his academic career, Sojo was full-time professor and researcher at the Monterrey Institute of Technology and Advanced Studies (ITESM), he has also held the position of research analyst for the University of Pennsylvania Link Project.

In addition to his articles in various periodicals and reviews, Sojo also published along with Lawrence Klein, winner of the Nobel Prize for Economics, his research on combined time-series and econometric modeling.

Mr. Sojo's most recent publications: "From Alternation of Power to Development" and "Public Policies in Democracy".

At the present, Eduardo Sojo is President of the Board of Governors of the National Institute of Statistics and Geography of Mexico.

Sojo studied economics at the Monterrey Institute of Technology and Advanced Studies and later earned a Master's Degree in Economics at the University of Pennsylvania and is a PHD candidate in Finance and Industrial Organization at the same university.
