The Institutional arrangement

- National System of Statistical and Geographical Information: effective coordination, ownership, active involvement.
- Technical Committees: assess quality of sources, methodologies, data and indicators.



Committee on MDG Information

- Chaired by the Office of the President: provides the broad view of the development agenda; vision.
- INEGI as the technical secretary advises on data sources, methodologies, reviews metadata. Provides the web dissemination.
- The committee produces annual and medium term work programs.



Sustainable development

- Sustainable development, understood as development that meets the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs.



Defining an agenda for Mexico

- Political leadership: moving towards the 2015-post development agenda.
- Organize a technical exercise to propose and define indicators by thematic block.
- Convene the main actors deciding and influencing public policy: government, academia, international organizations, civil society.



A holistic approach

- Analysis of interrelated phenomena.
- Sustainability.
- Social and economic inclusion.
- Gender equality / Equal rights

A national data revolution

- Looking opportunities for innovation

Sub-national reporting

- Heterogeneous regional development
- Independent local administrations.
- Administrative records.
- Identify base lines and targets for each state, because of regional inequalities.



Considerations on data and indicators

- Indicators suitable for us: proposed by Mexico and Indicators Beyond MDG
- Analysis of technical feasibility and data sources for new and improved indicators.
 - FOC and UNECE work



Considerations on data and indicators

- Keep in mind social and economic inclusion
- Strengthen the quality assurance framework for all data producers.
- Identify new data challenges for emerging issues: regularity, frequency, timeliness, coverage, granularity.



Current actions

- Drafting 2014 report on MDGs: keep everyone alert!
- Pilot test under way on indicators for **social inclusion** with **UNDP**
- Alignment of objectives and targets to the National Development Plan: looking for policy relevant indicators.



Current actions

- Holistic analysis of objectives and targets.
- Analyze the link to human rights as established in the Mexican Constitution.
- Explore channels and networks to facilitate the participation of civil society.
- Assess budgetary costs and adjustments for public policies.
