Results of the second Round of Worldwide Consultation

- 1. Overwhelming majority of comments agree with new presentation of this chapter
- 2. Countries share their national practices difficulties encountered, in particular, in the case of some countries, when moving to the general trade system.
- 3. Compilation/ estimation for free zones etc.
- 4. It is suggested to further specify the types of trade, besides re-exports and re-imports, which would be useful to identify via custom procedure (nature of transaction) codes.
