Please try to include the following points in your presentation:

Methodology and classifications used

- 1. Methodological guidelines and classifications used.
- 2. National deviations or exceptions.

Data sources and data compilation

- 3. Main sources of data e.g. surveys, administrative records, etc.
- 4. Creation and maintenance of business register/ address list of businesses involved in international services transactions if survey approach is used.
- 5. Copy of questionnaire for your main survey(s).
- 6. Features of main survey such as legal basis, service transactions covered, frequency, sample method and size, response rate, minimum transaction etc.
- 7. Benchmark or other estimates used in compilation/ Treatment of non-responses.
- 8. Numerical example.
- 9. Transactions included and excluded/ Checks for ensuring full coverage/ Crosscheck with additional sources / international reconciliation studies.

Organization and data processing

- 10. Collaboration with other institutions/ division of labor/ legal structure.
- 11. Number of staff.
- 12. Use of technology in data processing and production.
- 13. Which institution is responsible for the official publication of the data?

Data availability

- 14. Detail and length of time series.
- 15. Timeliness / Time-lag.
- 16. Revision policy.
- 17. Issues of confidentiality.

Priorities and plans for the future

- 18. Current priorities.
- 19. Future plans, i.e. data by partner country/ FATS statistics.
- 20. Problem areas.
- 21. Suggestions.
