27: List the most important and still unresolved problems:

Legal Framework:

• The absence of a law on statistics which force enterprises to provide information ...

Motivation:

• Enterprises are less motivated to provide information

... both cause a low response rate to surveys on services by the private sector

Resources:

 Creation and updating of business registers => dificulties in sample and expansion of sample results



Financial and human resources constraints

Methological issues:

 Volume and price indexes for exports and imports of services (national accounts)

Compilation of other services

 Lack of data harmonization and coordination among data providers

Comparability between BPM6 and MSITS

• Difficulties in implementing MSITS 2002, specially in statistics by mode of supply and the partner country data



28: What are the problems that you were able to solve in the past few years and experience which you could share with other countries

Institutional:

• Creation of an Interinstitutional Comitee on Service Statistics (Colombia, Costa Rica)

Motivation:

Progress in the visibility of the service sector (Col.)

Data improvement:

• ITRS implementation (Panama)

The use of datawarehouse software to access a large volume of high-frequency ITRS data has allowed the development of a solid business register and the improvement of sample methods and⁵ surveys (Brasil)

28: What are the problems that you were able to solve in the past few years and experience which you could share with other countries

Methological issues:

BPM5 implementation (Guatemala), EBOPS (Jamaica)

• Improvements in coverage and data sources, specially throught satellite accounts and/or specialized surveys (Argentina, Chile, Ecuador)

- Estimates Harmonization between SNA and Balance of Payments (Ven.)
- Mistakes in classification and discrepancies among data sources were solved based on requests to enterprises
