- "By facilitating data access and use, the Data Act should reduce burdens, both in the public sector and among businesses, mainly as a result of lowering transaction costs and in terms of efficiency gains".

Lessons learnt from the European experience relevant for NSOs



Implications of the Data Act on prospects for data-sharing in NSOs:

- Ask for data only once (from public sector).
- Direct access (data requests to private sector).
- Indirect access (through secondary data sharing in public sector).
- From "incentives" and "buying data" to "compensations".

Benefits for NSOs and users from the promulgation of overarching rules

- Ensures and regulates access to privately-held data.
- Free of charge (indirect access).
- Reasonable cost (direct access).
