

#### Francesca Perucci, Assistant Director, UN Statistics Division (UNSD)

Francesca Perucci oversees the work on global development monitoring, open data, data integration and dissemination, and other global data initiatives.

Francesca initiated her career in the UN as an adviser on gender and social statistics. Since then she has served in different positions within the UN system, where she has been an active leader in developing and promoting the use of data and statistics to inform development policies and review and monitor progress, and has pioneered new ways of

producing, analyzing and communicating data to be used effectively for policy and decision making.

She has authored a number of articles on social and gender statistics, the UN publication known as The World's Women in 1995 and 2000, and several statistical manuals on gender statistics and social statistics. She was the lead author of the MDG Report from 2005 to 2012 and currently oversees the preparation of the yearly progress report on the SDGs.



### Gero Carletto Calogero (Gero), Manager, Data Production and Methods Unit in the Development Data Group, World Bank.

Calogero (Gero) Carletto is the Manager of the Data Production and Methods Unit in the Development Data Group at the World Bank. For more than a decade, he has led the Living Standards Measurement Survey (LSMS), the flagship survey program at the World Bank. In 2015, he founded the Center for Development Data - a hub dedicated to fostering methodological innovation and strengthening capacity in household surveys in low- and middle-income countries - which he directed until mid-2019. Gero has more than twenty-five years of experience in the collection,

analysis and dissemination of household survey data. He has published dozens of scholarly articles on various topics ranging from poverty, migration, agriculture and rural development, as well as data collection methods and measurement issues. Gero holds a Ph.D. in Agricultural and Resource Economics from the University of California at Berkeley.



### Andrew A. Tellewoyan, Head of Industrial Statistics and SDGs Focal Point, Liberia Institute of Statistics and Geo-Information Services (LISGIS)

Andrew A. Tellewoyan is the SDGs Focal Point at the Liberia Institute of Statistics and Geo-Information Services (LISGIS). He has served in this capacity since the launch of the SDGs in Liberia in 2016. In addition to this role, Andrew is Head of Industrial Statistics under which Price Statistics is a core function. Andrew holds a Master of Science Degree in Applied Labour Economics for Development from the University of Turin in Italy and an Executive Master in Economics from the Paris Institute of Political

Studies (Sciences Po), Paris, France. He also holds a Master's Degree in Business Administration from the Cuttington University. Andrew began work with LISGIS as Data Collector in 2006 and served in several capacities thereafter. In 2019, he rose to the position of National Coordinator for Liberia's Population and Housing Census 2021 Project – the position he currently occupies while coordinating the SDGs Monitoring.



#### Carol Coy, Director General, Statistical Institute of Jamaica (STATIN)

Carol Coy is the Director General of the Statistical Institute of Jamaica (STATIN), Jamaica's National Statistics Office. Appointed to this post in April 1, 2013, she is the chief statistician in Jamaica, with responsibility for the strategic development of STATIN and the development of Jamaica's National Statistics System. She is tasked with safeguarding the production and publication of high-quality official statistics on Jamaica that are responsive to the needs of policymakers and other stakeholders.

Prior to assuming this role, Carol served as Deputy Director General of STATIN, providing leadership and oversight the technical divisions of the

Institute. She is also an experienced National Accountant, and for over three decades has been instrumental in the development and maintenance of the national accounts estimates for the Jamaican economy. She has contributed much to the field of National Accounts locally, regionally and internationally serving for over thirteen years as STATIN's Director of National Accounts.

She is currently a member of the United Nations Statistics Division's Advisory Expert Group on National Accounts and the Caribbean Community's (CARICOM) Advisory Group on Statistics.



## Johannes Jutting, Executive Head, Partnership in Statistics for Development in the 21st Century (PARIS21)

Johannes Jütting leads PARIS21's work in strengthening national statistical systems, promoting the integration of statistics and reliable data in the decision-making process and advocating for countries as crucial actors in the global development agenda. Prior to joining PARIS21, Johannes led poverty reduction teams at the OECD Development Centre and at the Centre for Global Development Research (ZEF). Johannes holds a PhD in Development and Agriculture Economics from Humboldt-University and regularly publishes about

issues relating to data, statistics, development and the Sustainable Development Goals.

Johannes also served as a member of the Programme Committee for the first and second United Nations World Data Forum.
