



How COVID-19 is affecting people's lives



Changes to staffing, UK, 23 March to 5 April 2020 For UK businesses that are <u>continuing to trade</u> (75.4% of responding businesses)



Note: The percentages in this chart will not sum to 100% as businesses were able to select multiple

options of all businesses responding in this period, 24.3% have temporarily paused trading, 0.3%




