New Zealand Geographic Board Ngā Pou Taunaha o Aotearoa** implementation of three new placenaming standards

Summary***

Standards provide the criteria for standardized, best practice geographical naming. The New Zealand Geographic Board Ngā Pou Taunaha o Aotearoa will report on its implementation in 2020 of three new place-naming standards, namely, the Standard for New Zealand place names, the standard for Antarctic place names and the standard for altering region and district names. In May 2020, version 3 of the Board's standard for Crown-protected area names also came into effect. The Board's standard for undersea feature names, which was published in 2016, has proved to be effective tool in the Board's decision-making.
