## International Seminar on Sea Names, 2019~2020<sup>1</sup>

#### **Summary**

The International Seminar on Sea Names, which began in 1995, continued its annual meeting in 2019 and 2020. More than forty participants each year discussed the issues of geographical naming in paper presentations and panel discussions, with specific focus on maritime names. In continuation of the main topics of the past few years, the 25th Seminar in 2019 broadened its scope into education under the title *Educating for Diversity through Geographical Names*. The 26th Seminar in 2020, titled *Geographical Naming in the Digital Era*, took specific note of the changing environment of naming in the digital era. The papers and discussion points were published in a book each year. A total of 398 papers have been presented since the 1st Seminar.

The International Seminar on Sea Names continued its annual meeting in 2019 and 2020; in Alexandria, Virginia, U.S.A. (25<sup>th</sup>, July 2019) and Gangneung (26<sup>th</sup>, September 2020). More than forty participants each year discussed the issues of geographical naming in paper presentations and panel discussions, with specific focus on maritime names. As many as twenty-three papers were presented during this period. The 26<sup>th</sup> Seminar was held in a hybrid format combining online and offline participation. It was broadcast by live streaming. This annual seminar has been co-organized by The Society for East Sea and the Northeast Asian History Foundation. The 25<sup>th</sup> Seminar was held in conjunction with the Virginia Geographic Alliance, a teachers' group in Virginia and adjacent areas.

Each seminar was titled with a main theme and divided into a few issue-oriented sub-themes (Table 1). In continuation of the main topics of the past few years, the 25<sup>th</sup> Seminar in 2019 broadened its scope into education under the title *Educating for Diversity through Geographical Names*. The 26<sup>th</sup> Seminar in 2020, titled *Geographical Naming in the Digital Era*, took specific note of the changing environment of naming in the digital era. The results of each seminar, including revised papers and discussion points, were published in a book with the title of the main theme.

When launched in 1995, the initial motivation of the seminar was to seek a resolution to the disagreement on the naming of the sea between the Korean Peninsula and the Japanese Archipelago. It has meaningfully developed as an international forum to discuss the general issues on the international standardization of geographical names. A total of 398 papers have been presented so far. The 27<sup>th</sup> International Seminar on Sea Names is scheduled to be held again in Gangneung, Korea, in October 2021.
