International Seminar on Sea Names, 2021–2022

Submitted by Republic of Korea**

Summary

The International Seminar on Sea Names, which began in 1995, continued in 2021 and 2022. More than 40 participants in gatherings of a few days each year discussed the issues of geographical naming in paper presentations and panel discussions, with a specific focus on maritime names. In continuation of the main topics of the recent years, the 27th Seminar in 2021 broadened its scope to cover the dynamic environment of naming in the digital era under the title "Geographic Naming in the Digital Era – Season Two." The 28th Seminar in 2022, titled "A New Horizon Toward the Resolution of Disputed Names," was aimed at looking ahead to a new horizon for resolving disputed geographical names. The papers and discussion points were published in a book each year. A total of 417 papers have been presented since the 1st Seminar.

International Seminar on Sea Names, 2021–2022¹

The International Seminar on Sea Names continued in 2021 (Gangneung, Korea; 27 October 2021) and 2022 (Pohang, Korea; 28 September 2022). More than 40 participants in each year discussed the issues of geographical naming in paper presentations and panel discussions, with a specific focus on maritime names. As many as 16 papers were presented during this period. While the 27th Seminar was held in a hybrid format, combining online and offline participation with broadcasting by live streaming, the 28th Seminar adopted an offline format with in-person participants. This annual seminar was coorganized by the Society for East Sea and the Northeast Asian History Foundation.

Each seminar was titled with a main theme and divided into issue-oriented sub-themes (Table 1). In continuation of the main topics of recent years, the 27th Seminar in 2021 broadened its scope to cover the dynamic environment of naming in the digital era under the title *Geographical Naming in the Digital Era – Season Two*. The 28th Seminar in 2022, titled *A New Horizon Toward the Resolution of Disputed Names*, was aimed at looking ahead to a new horizon for resolving disputed geographical names. The results of each seminar, including revised papers and discussion points, were published in a book with the title of the main theme.

When launched in 1995, the initial motivation of the seminar was to seek a resolution to the disagreement on the naming of the sea between the Korean Peninsula and the Japanese Archipelago. It has meaningfully developed into an international forum to discuss general issues on the international standardization of geographical names. To date, a total of 417 papers have been presented.
